- The pollution of the spruit is of great concern and has mainly two sources sewer leaks into the sewer system in the residential areas around the reserve and from people washing waste before delivering it to re-cycling depots.
- General condition of the palisade fence.
- Vagrant's forcing their way into the reserve and using the reserve as a base for crimes in the adjacent residential areas.
- Lack of membership and participation of members.
- Lack of funds for projects and general maintenance.
- Development of ptn of stand 88.
