Alien Hacks



Volunteers have been removing large areas of invasive plants in the reserve. Birds, wind or water spread the seeds all over the reserve. The problem plants have become well established and are crowding out the indigenous plants.

The River Starts Here!

As part of the WaterCAN Annual Water Testing week (17 – 24 September) we tested the water in the Rademeyerspruit where it enters the reserve. WaterCAN kindly supplied the testing kit that was used. Citizen scientists from all over South Africa participated in the Water Testing week. A map of the results is available on www.watercan.org.za/map/.

The results for the chemical tests looked good, but unfortunately the bacterial tests indicated that the water in the Rademeyerspruit is not safe to drink. We will continue to monitor the water quality with tests like this and the MiniSASS evaluations.
